### BACKGROUND:

The Board of Trustees met previously on November 25, 2025, and gave staff approval to continue working with the project consultant team at DTJ Design to finalize the aquatics design and to rework phasing at Richardson (MVP) park. Additionally, it was to include in those efforts the PORT recommendations from the November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2025 port meeting which were:

PORT recommended the Board proceed with plans for an outdoor pool at Richardson Park with additional items as recommended. The committee agreed those recommended items/amenities are: 8 lap lanes and associated competition equipment, zero-depth entry, and a deep end with a diving board.

DTJ has provided an updated aquatics draft design and associated phasing plan that staff intends to present for review with the Board. Staff did present the updates to the PORT committee on January 7<sup>th</sup>, 2026, as directed and received committee comments/feedback. We will share that feedback during the meeting.

### FISCAL IMPACT AND FUND SOURCE:

Construction funds for the project are budgeted in the 2026 Capital Fund

### COMMUNITY TOUCHSTONES:
