

## ORDINANCE NO. 272

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING OF  
PUBLIC DANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD,  
COLORADO:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or other organization to hold, stage, conduct or operate a public dance or permit dancing, where beer is served, without first having obtained a license therefor as herein provided.

Section 2. Any person, firm, corporation or other organization desiring such a license shall make application to the Town Clerk, giving such information as the Clerk may desire for a proper understanding of said application, accompanied by the license fee hereinafter specified, which fee shall be returned if the license is denied. The Clerk shall present said application to the Board of Trustees at the next regular or special meeting and the Board may in its discretion grant or reject said application.

Section 3. The fee for such a license shall be \$25.00 for one calendar quarter. Such license shall be non-transferable and no refund will be made for part of a quarter.

Section 4. Such license shall be deemed to be conditioned that the licensee shall conduct clean, orderly, moral dances and no loud, boisterous, rowdy or unseemly conduct shall be permitted; and undesirable persons of bad morals or low reputation and intoxicated persons shall not be permitted to dance. Such dances shall at all times be subject to the supervision of the Town Marshal, who shall have authority to stop a dance and close the place where it is conducted if these conditions are violated.

All dances conducted hereunder shall close promptly and dancing cease at the hour of 12 o'clock midnight. No dancing shall be permitted on Sunday.

In addition to other penalties prescribed herein the Board of Trustees may revoke a license for violation of this Section.

Section 5. Violation of the terms of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor and any person, upon conviction of such violation, shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00, and each day of the continuance of a violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense.
