

ORDINANCE NO. 360

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR OVER-LAPPING FOUR-YEAR TERMS FOR THE OFFICE OF TRUSTEES AND FOR A FOUR-YEAR TERM FOR THE OFFICE OF MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO, PURSUANT TO LAW MADE AND PROVIDED.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, COLORADO:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide continued experience in the offices of Mayor and Trustees and further to provide a reasonable time for the elected Mayor and Trustees of the Town of Berthoud to accomplish and complete programs and pursue work in progress during an elected term.

Section 2. Commencing with the 1972 election of the Trustees of the Town of Berthoud, Colorado, the three candidates receiving the highest number of votes cast in said election shall be elected to a four-year term, and the three candidates receiving the lesser number of votes cast shall be elected for a two-year term. Commencing with the next bi-annual election in 1974, the elected candidates shall serve a four-year term and at the bi-annual elections thereafter trustees shall be elected for four-year terms, the provisions hereunder providing for over-lapping four-year terms of the office of Trustees.

Section 3. Commencing with the 1972 election of the Mayor for the Town of Berthoud, the term shall be four years.

Section 4. Effective Date. The Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud herewith finds, determines and designates that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety; and whereas, in the opinion of the Board of Trustees, an emergency exists, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately after its final passage, adoption and publication.


