

ORDINANCE NO. 354

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO, BY AMENDING CHAPTER 7, SUBSECTION 7.7 RELATING TO THE CHARGE FOR SEWER TAPS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO:

Section 1.

That Chapter 7, Subsection 7.7 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Berthoud, Colorado be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

7.7 Tapping Charge and Maintenance. Any person upon the application for a permit to connect with the town sewage system shall, at the time of making such application, pay to the Town Clerk the sum of \$350.00 within the corporate limits and the sum of \$700.00 ~~or a sum corresponding and~~ (Outside the identical to the water tap fees, if any, assessed to the corporate limits) subject premises pursuant to Chapter 6 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Berthoud and as amended, whichever is higher. Furthermore, the property owner shall install and maintain the entire service line to the town sewage main at his sole expense together with the costs, if any, of the repairs to the oil or concrete surfacing of a street.

With regard to a sewer tap outside the corporate limits the aforesaid fee of \$700.00 shall increase proportionately by the square of the diameter of the water tap serving the location in the event said water tap exceeds three-fourths inch.

The aforesaid tap fees shall be charged for each dwelling or occupied unit to be served notwithstanding the fact that a lesser number of taps are installed to adequately service the particular location.

The aforesaid tap fees shall be charged upon all new taps applied for after June 30, 1971.

Upon applications for new sewer taps submitted to the Town prior to June 30, 1971, there shall be the additional charge to conform to the fees set out above in Section 1 in the event the dwelling, unit or improvement for which such application is made is not fully completed on or before December 31, 1971.

Section 2.

The Board of Trustees herewith finds, determines and designates that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety; and whereas in the opinion of the Board of Trustees an emergency exists, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately after its final passage and adoption

This Ordinance was introduced, read, passed on 1st reading and ordered published by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud at its regular meeting held this 8th day of June, A.D., 1971.
