

ORDINANCE NO. 317

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, COLORADO, ADOPTING BY REFERENCE THE "MODEL TRAFFIC CODE FOR COLORADO MUNICIPALITIES, 1966" REPEALING ORDINANCES NO. 296 AND 301 AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, COLORADO:

Section 1. Pursuant to Chapter 139, Article 34, C.R.S., 1963 there is hereby adopted for the purpose of regulating traffic within the Town of Berthoud, that certain ordinance known as the "Model Traffic Code for Colorado Municipalities, 1966" officially approved, adopted and published as such by the Colorado Highway Safety Council and hereinafter referred to as the "Municipal Traffic Code" of which three (3) copies are now filed in the office of the Town and may be inspected during regular business hours, the same being adopted as if set out at length save and except the following articles and sections which are declared to be inapplicable to this municipality and are thereby expressly deleted:

1. Section 26-2 at page 59, Penalties for Violation;
2. Section 27-6, Effective Date, at page 60;
3. Part E. Appendix, page 61, Article XXVIII,
Sections 28-1 through and including 28-12.

Section 2. Chief of Police is hereby vested with the responsibility for traffic control and appointed by the Board to serve as traffic engineer in this municipality and he shall cause records to be kept in compliance with Section 23-12 of the "Model Traffic Code for Colorado Municipalities, 1966".

Section 3. (a) That it is unlawful for any person to violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance and such violations shall be punishable as is hereinafter provided.

(b) Any person who shall be convicted of a violation of this Ordinance shall be fined in a sum of not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), or imprisoned for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days, for each offense., Where any violation is a continuing offense, each day that the violation continues shall be considered and held to be a separate and distinct offense.

Section 4. The Board of Trustees herewith finds, determines and designates that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for regulation of traffic affects the public health and safety, ~~and~~ whereas in the opinion of the Board of Trustees an emergency exists, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its final passage, adoption and publication.

The above Ordinance was passed on second reading and adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud, Colorado, at its regular meeting held on 11th October, 1966.
