

ORDINANCE NO. 428

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE CONTINGENCY FUND TO THE WATER DEPARTMENT TO DEFRAY EXPENSES IN EXCESS OF AMOUNTS BUDGETED: FOR THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1.

WHEREAS, pursuant to law made and provided, the Town of Berthoud is required, by Ordinance, to transfer funds from the Contingency Fund in excess of amounts budgeted; and,

WHEREAS, during the fiscal year of 1976, it was necessary to install, at a cost of \$2,867.81, a sum not in the budget of the Water Department, a 6" inch water line 186 feet in the area of the cemetery to provide adequate water pressure, and an emergency source of domestic water for the Town from the Little Thompson Valley Water District.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

Section 2.

That \$2,867.81, the cost of said 6" inch water line be transferred from the Contingency Fund to the Town of Berthoud Water Department Fund.

Section 3.

This ordinance was introduced, read, passed on first reading and ordered published by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud at its meeting held this 14th day of December, 1976.

Section 4.

The Board of Trustees of the Town has determined that an emergency condition existed which necessitated the installation of the aforesaid pipeline in order to insure an emergency supply of domestic water thereby necessitating the aforesaid expenditure during 1976, and this Ordinance shall therefor take effect immediately.
