

ORDINANCE NO. 613

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE EXECUTION OF A LONG TERM LEASE BY THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, COLORADO:

Section 1.

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interests of the Town of Berthoud in general and the gymnastics program being operated by the Recreation Department of the Town of Berthoud to lease a facility from which a gymnastics program can be conducted and managed.

Section 2. Authorization Pursuant to C.R.S. 31-15-801

Pursuant to 31-15-801 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud hereby authorizes and empowers the Mayor, Town Superintendent, and Town Clerk to enter into a lease for property known as 1005 B Second Street, Berthoud, Colorado on a year to year basis not to exceed a total of three (3) years. The terms of this lease shall be substantially in accordance with the lease reviewed by the Board of Trustees at its meeting on the 8th day of September, 1987 which has been made a matter of public record.

Section 3. Lease Payment

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud hereby authorizes the Town Superintendent to place in the budget such funding as will be necessary to adequately and timely fulfill the financial obligations of the town in accordance with the terms of the lease.

Section 4. Effective Date

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud herewith finds, determines and designates that this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after publication.

At its meeting held September 8, 1987, a public hearing was set by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud for its meeting held on the 22nd day of September, 1987. After the public hearing, the Ordinance was read, passed and ordered published by the Board of Trustees at its meeting this 22nd day of September, 1987.
