

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, from the inception of this nation, it has been the responsibility of the states and their local governments to adopt legislation and enforce laws and ordinances whenever necessary to protect their citizens' health, welfare and safety;

WHEREAS, it has been a fundamental part of the democratic principles of this nation to involve all interested and affected parties from both the public and private sectors in the formulation, adoption and, to the fullest extent possible, in the administration of such laws and ordinances;

WHEREAS, among the most basic of the laws and ordinances which have been so derived are those acts which assure the public's health and safety in the buildings in which people live, work and play;

WHEREAS, to assure such safety, the Town of Berthoud, enforces the Uniform Building Code which has been designed and is maintained with the assistance of the building industry and the customers;

WHEREAS, it is through the efforts of local building officials and their cooperative relationship with the construction industry that the administration of these health and life-safety regulations is assured;

NOW THEREFORE, I Richard Strachan, Mayor, do hereby designate the week of April 9-13, 1990, as National Building Safety Week within the Town of Berthoud.

I urge all citizens of this community to use this week to visit their local building department and to better familiarize themselves with the important safety information and services provided by these public servants.
