

RESOLUTION NO. 12-01

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, LARIMER AND WELD COUNTIES, COLORADO DECLARING THE TWO BUILDINGS OF THE LITTLE THIMPSON VALLEY PIONEER MUSEUM AS HISTORIC STRUCTURES.

WHEREAS, the preservation of history, culture, and the Heritage of Berthoud community and the Little Thompson Valley are integral parts of the governmental obligations; and,

WHEREAS, many historical items have been assembled, categorized and are displayed in the two buildings which constitute the Little Thompson Valley Pioneer Museum; and,

WHEREAS, one of these buildings was formerly the Bimson Blacksmith Shop; and,

WHEREAS, additional historic structures may be moved or rebuilt on these sites;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD, LARIMER AND WELD COUNTIES, COLORADO THAT:

1. Pursuant to the 1997 Uniform Building Code the Little Thompson Valley Pioneer Museum and other historical structures which may be moved onto or rebuilt at 222 and 224 Mountain Avenue, Berthoud, Colorado, said real property being more particularly described respectively as Lot 2, Block 7, original Town of Berthoud and Lots 3 and 4 and the East 10 feet of Lot 5, Block 7, original Town of Berthoud, Larimer County, Colorado, are hereby declared to be historic buildings.
2. The special historical and architectural significance of historic buildings mandate that the repairs, alterations, and additions necessary to preserve, restore, and rehabilitate these buildings for their continued use as historical structures used to store and display historical artifacts of the Little Thompson Valley necessitates the classification of these buildings as historic buildings.

This resolution was introduced, read and passed at the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees held on May 22, 2001 by a vote of 6 in favor and 0 opposed.
