Help to Preserve our Water

Because we live in a semi-arid climate and only get about 15" of rain a year, we must do what we can to preserve the water we have. The last few decades have been warmer than average, and watering our lush, green front yard lawns causes a strain on the Town's water infrastructure every summer. To help alleviate some of this undue strain and preserve this precious resource, the Town has teamed up with Resource Central, an award-winning non-profit determined to make conservation simple. Below are some of their most successful programs:

Garden in A Box kits are filled with beautiful, low-water perennials and grasses chosen specifically for Colorado yards. They come with young plants, plant-by-number maps, and care instructions for easy planting. Replacing an average-sized lawn with one of these beautiful gardens will save around 7,300 gallons of water over the garden's lifetime.

Are you interested in replacing your thirsty lawn with a beautiful, low-water landscape? Check out their **Lawn Replacement Program**. Simply plan your project, choose your discounts, then apply. After that, you'll have a phone consultation with Resource Central xeriscape advisors; if you qualify, you'll be ready to remove some lawn. Once the grass is gone, pick up your FREE plants, plant them using their helpful guides, and watch them bloom!

Not ready to give up your lawn just yet? You can sign up for a free **Slow the Flow Sprinkler Evaluation** starting in June. Like a car, your sprinklers need an occasional check-up to ensure they're watering your lawn efficiently. When done right, your lawn should only require water twice a week. Evaluations last about 75 minutes and could help you save thousands of gallons of water each year and keep your yard healthy.
