Mosquitos

After a warm and wet spring, we are in for a buggy summer. Unfortunately, some of those bugs, namely mosquitos, can transmit West Nile Virus (WNV). Although all age groups are at risk for WNV, individuals over the age of 50 and those with compromised immune systems have the highest risk of severe disease. WNV can be fatal to anybody, regardless of age or health. Fortunately, you can take measures to help protect yourself by following the Four Ds:

- Mosquitos breed in water, so by **DRAINING** any standing water in your backyard every week, you are reducing the number of places they can multiply.
- Limit the time you spend outdoors at **DUSK** through **DAWN**, when mosquitos are most active and feeding.
- If you find yourself outside at dusk or dawn, be sure to **DRESS** in lightweight, long sleeves and pants. Also, spray clothing with insect repellent since mosquitos can bite through clothing.
- Anytime you are outside and bugs are biting, it's best to **DEFEND** yourself with an approved repellent. Apply it sparingly to the skin, and, again, make sure you spray your clothing.
