Budget

The Town budget process is one of the most important policy decisions made by the Berthoud Town Board. During this process, we allocate funds for the next year to ensure we have the services and resources available to make Berthoud one of the best places in Colorado to live. Department supervisors and the Town Administrator review staff recommendations for the budget in July and August. Then, the Town's Board of Trustees review and adjust these sections. Once finalized, the Board adopts the budget, which is then submitted to the County and the State by the end of each year. Fats, Oils, & Grease (FOG)

Now that we are heading into the big cooking season, it's a good time to remind everyone that dumping Fats, Oils, and Grease (F.O.G.) down your drain is never a good idea. After a while, the grease builds up and causes sewer backups, which are not fun and can be expensive to fix.

Instead of rinsing them down your drain, pour the leftover drippings and grease into a disposable container and allow it to cool before disposing of it in the trash. Then wipe out the pan with a paper towel before you wash it. These simple tips will help keep your plumbing healthy and the sewage out of your home.
