DEA Drug Takeback Day – October 26

Protect your family and the environment by responsibly disposing of your unneeded or expired prescription and over-the-counter medications at the Oct. 26 Drug Enforcement Agency's National Medication Take Back Day. Proper disposal of unused medication prevents the potential for accidents and misuse, protecting children and teens from harm. Medications flushed down the toilet or thrown in the trash can contaminate water systems and threaten wildlife. The Larimer County Sheriff's office will be stationed outside of Town Hall from 10:00 am – 2:00 pm to accept your medications for proper disposal. If you can't make it, old medications are collected year-round in the green drop box at Berthoud Drug through the Colorado Household Medication Take-Back Program.

The Changing of the Season Means Changing of the Chores

It has been a long, hot summer, and fall is finally upon us. That means less weeding and mowing but more raking and shoveling. We want to thank you now for being a good neighbor this fall and winter. Raking leaves in your yard for bagging or mulching and not into the street keeps them from clogging up the Town's stormwater drains and street sweepers. And, as we approach snow season, please remember to remove snow from your sidewalks within 24 hours of a storm ending. Keeping your sidewalk clear allows kids to walk to their buses and adults to get some exercise or walk their dogs, and it is greatly appreciated.

2025 Berthoud Budget Process

Each fall, municipalities across Colorado bring their budgets to their elected officials and community for discussion. Municipal budgets must be balanced; Town expenses must not exceed revenue, and a minimum amount must be held in reserves. The 2024 budget is tentatively \$15.8 million. The Town of Berthoud is discussing the 2025 budget now through early December. Citizens are welcome to attend upcoming Board of Trustees meetings to hear more about the different funding sources and expenses that are being determined for 2025. You may find more information on Berthoud's budget as well as monthly financial reports online at Berthoud.org/finance. The initial introduction of the 2025 budget will occur on October 8th.
