Fats, Oil & Grease (FOG)

Now that we are heading into the season of big meals, it's time to remind everyone that pouring Fats, Oils, and Grease (F.O.G.) down the drain is a bad idea. The fats eventually build up and can cause sewer backups, which are inconvenient and expensive to fix. (If you're also flushing "flushable" wipes, those get stuck in the grease and can make things even worse.)



Instead of rinsing the F.O.G.s down the drain or flushing them down the toilet, pour the leftover drippings and grease into a disposable container and allow it to cool before disposing it in the trash. Then wipe out the pan with a paper towel before you wash it. Doing this will help keep your plumbing healthy and the sewage out of your home.
