Berthoud Report A Concern

One of Berthoud's many charms as a small town is that every resident plays a part in shaping the community. Whether by sitting on one of our boards, volunteering with any of the local non-profits, or attending our twice-monthly Board meetings to share insights or listen, your participation makes this town unique. Because our Town staff is relatively small in relation to the size of the community, we have launched a new tool, **Berthoud Report a Concern (BRAC)**.

This simple-to-use online resource lets residents notify town staff of code violations, water or wastewater issues, problems at our parks or open spaces, and other general issues like streetlight outages. Visiting **Berthoud.org/concern** lets you quickly and easily submit a report and include a location and photos. Each report is sent to the appropriate department and addressed promptly.

Concerns can also be reported by phone at **970-532-2643**, if you cannot access our website. If your matter is more urgent, we have after-hour emergency numbers for our Water, Streets, and Parks Departments. (If it is a true emergency, though, please call 911)

The BRAC tool allows residents to contribute to our community's guardianship, ensuring it remains vibrant and welcoming. On the flip side, you are enthusiastically welcome to alert us if you notice something that looks fantastic or was done well. Our team works hard to make Berthoud a place you're proud to call home, so good or bad; let us know what you see when you're out and about. Together, we can make a difference and keep Berthoud beautiful.
