NOCO Alert

As we've seen, grass fires can pop up quickly. Signing up for Larimer County's NOCO Alert is the best way to ensure you receive a notification when danger is near. There are two ways to sign up.

1. **Visit NOCOAlert.org:** create an account and choose what information you'd like to receive and the method by which you would like to receive it; Text, E-mail, or by phone.
2. **Text NOCOAlert to 888777** to receive emergency alerts sent throughout Larimer County, regardless of your location, via text message only. There is no account to create, and they do not collect personal information. (Text STOPNOCOAlert to opt out.)



Larimer County also maintains an emergency information line at **(970) 498-5500**, where vital incident information is recorded as needed. They frequently staff their information center during significant events with Public Information Officers (PIOs) who will respond to questions. Much of the same emergency information will also be posted to Nocoalert.org or www.larimer.org/emergency.

Berthoud's Community Clean-Up Event: April 25 – May 10, 2025.

It's almost time for Berthoud's annual Community Clean-Up Event. Town of Berthoud residents are encouraged to stop by Town Hall any time **after April 21** during regular business hours, Monday – Thursday, 7:00 am – 5:30 pm, and pick up your landfill voucher. Then, go through your garage, basement, and closets, pile up the useless clutter, and haul it to the Larimer County landfill. With your voucher, the Town will cover the cost of dumping a truck with a trailer filled with most household items. However, tires, electronics, and appliances with freon will be subject to additional fees. (Residents must pay any extra fees at the main gate.)
