September Is National Preparedness Month

We are currently in wildfire season, so now is a great time to be sure you are ready if an emergency should occur close to your home.

Have a plan: Fires and storms do not care that you are busy or that your family is not together, so knowing how you'll find each other if you are separated is essential. Your plan should also include a packing list, so you know what to grab if the emergency requires you to evacuate quickly. Include overnight items, documents, medications, and items needed for your pet.

Build a kit: Have a collection of essential items needed in an emergency. Include staples like water, food, a hand-crank radio, a first aid kit, and flashlights. If you already have an emergency kit, check it annually to ensure all the items are ready for use. **Visit Ready.gov for a complete list of supplies needed for a basic disaster kit.**

Sign up for Emergency Alerts: Visit Nocoalert.org to sign up for alerts sent to your phone. The sooner you are alerted to danger, the more time you will have to prepare for evacuation, and the better your chances of survival.

Visit Ready.gov for information on how to be prepared for any emergency.

As a bonus, and way to celebrate the end of the season, Brandon will give away two 1.5 ft tall seedlings. (One Oak and one Catalpa) We meet at the picnic table on the west side of the park, and we hope to see you there!

Toy Bikes in Berthoud

Mini-bikes have exploded in popularity. We get it. They're pretty inexpensive, and they're fun. However, it is important to understand that, just like golf carts, there are rules around where they can go. Defined as "Toy Vehicles" by Colorado Revised Statute

42-1-102 (103.5), they include gas-powered or electric-powered mini bikes, "pocket" bikes, kamikaze boards, go-peds, and stand-up scooters, and they may not be ridden on public roadways, sidewalks, bike trails, parks, fields, or any other areas commonly used by pedestrians and bicyclists. While they may seem like a quick way for kids to get around town or to school, these toy vehicles are subject to the same laws as adults, and their riders may be cited. It is worth noting that these rules do not apply to electric bicycles. If it has functioning pedals, it's a bike; if it doesn't, it's a "toy vehicle".
