## IMPORTANT TOWN PROJECTS KICK OFF CONSTRUCTION

Exciting things are happening in Berthoud. Read more about these town projects breaking ground this summer:

### Roberts Lake Pier Construction

Roberts Lake is the most used Town lake for fishing and wildlife viewing. This project will renovate the current pier to make it ADA-Compliant, add a bench along the north shoreline fishing location and increase the size of the pier for a more improved fishing experience.

Amenities at this site will also include a parking area, restrooms, covered picnic areas and a natural play area.

Gerrard Excavating will be completing this project. This project is expected to open to the public in spring 2020.

### Berthoud Reservoir

The Berthoud Reservoir is the newest lake and natural area public amenity with a tentative opening date of spring 2020. This summer, construction is kicking off to make this area a fishing, paddling and wildlife viewing destination.

### Bein Park Playground

We are excited to begin construction updating the playground located at Bein Park. The existing playground will be removed and a new constructed play area that is ADA-compliant will be installed along with new ground material.

## COUNTY ROAD 7 IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

The Town will be making road improvements to County Road 7 this summer. This includes replacing 1.25 miles of asphalt pavement surface. Crews will also be improving the storm drainage pathways along the road which will include new stormwater infrastructure.

This project is partially paid for by a DOLA mineral and energy grant, with additional funds coming from Weld County. Kehn Construction will be completing the work. Construction is set to begin in the middle of July, so be sure to watch out for crews along the road later this month.

## SMALL BUGS, BIG PROBLEMS

Summer is in full swing and so are the mosquitoes. Protect yourself from West Nile Virus by following these guidelines:

Use an effective insect repellent.

Dress in long sleeves and pants.

Avoid areas with mosquitoes during dawn and dusk, when mosquitoes that carry the virus are most active.

Repair any holes or tears in screens on doors and windows to prevent mosquitoes from getting inside your home.

Drain standing water—a mosquito magnet—from your lawn.

## SUMMER CODES TO FOLLOW

Summer is a busy time of year with many people spending extra time outside and away from the home. Make sure you are in compliance by adhering to these important code enforcement policies:

Cut and remove all weeds and grasses around your property.

Make sure to keep your property clean by housing all garbage in containers and removing any accumulated trash from your property.

Water responsibly and don't run any major irrigation systems between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.
