The Town of Berthoud is excited to announce that you can pay your utility bills online. Last month, the Town announced a partnership with Xpress Bill Pay. This electronic service will allow Berthoud residents to access their account information online, set up one-time or recurring payments and enroll in paperless billing—making bill paying faster, easier and more convenient.

The change is a response to requests from residents as well as Town staff, who will now have the ability to process payments and requests much faster and more efficiently.

Cindy Leach, senior accountant for the Town of Berthoud, said “We are very excited to be able to offer Xpress Bill Pay as an option to Berthoud citizens. In order to determine the system’s ease of use, some of our staff were the first sign up with autopay and paperless billing. They love it, and we hope the Berthoud citizens do, too.”

## STOP BEFORE YOU POUR

Before you dump any excess grease and drippings from your food down the drain, think twice. Sewer backups are a big deal and can be a costly fix. To avoid this problem, don't dump fats, oils and grease (FOG) down your drain. Below are some tips for disposing of FOG correctly.



### 1. COOL IT

Allow FOG to cool and then dispose of it in a trash can.

### 2. CAN IT

Pour any fats into an old container.

### 3. TRASH IT

Dispose of your FOG in a trashcan, not down the drain.

### 4. SCRAPE IT

Wipe FOG and food scraps from plates and pans into a trash can.
